We've become a force to reckon with indie authors now wear more hats than ever as we strive to create a career full of meaning prosperity, and potential. We have juggled the demands and continue to be rebels in the face of adversity. Now, after years of hearing the shelves of hustle and grind, we indies are rebelling again, gone are the days of publishing a book a month until we drop, and in its place are the seeds of a better way to rapid release, a way that feels incredible as we build a sustainable, lifelong author career, that not only increases our visibility and royalties, but it's all done with intention and ease. If you're ready to buck the system and become the visionary entrepreneur, I know you're meant to be, you've come to the right place. I'm Carissa Andrews, international best selling indie author, and this is the Author Revolution Podcast. Hey there guys, welcome back to the Author Revolution Podcast. Now this week, I want to dive in to a really awesome interview that I'm having with the creators of the anthology turning the tide. Now, this is a project that I'm actually personally involved in. But I didn't even know some of the details that I found out through the course of interviewing Sonya Sargent and Anthony Strong, they are a husband, wife duo that is in the process of creating this anthology that is all about supporting the humanitarian efforts for the war in Ukraine. I don't know about you. But for me, it's been a very tumultuous time because as heart centered individuals, as people who are seeing what's going on in the world, we have a couple of choices, right, we have the ability to look at the things that make our heart hurt, and try to make them better. Or we have the ability to kind of tune out a little bit and not look so much at the things that we do not want to perpetuate in the world. So we have choices. And sometimes that choice to not look at the thing that is bringing us down or making our vibe kind of dwindle or hurting our hearts. It's still a tough one because you feel like you're not doing enough. And so when I got tapped by Sonia to be a part of this anthology, it lit me up in a way that I didn't realize I was feeling like I was missing. Hopefully that makes sense. Because it was like I didn't know what to do in order to put my energy towards the good that can happen from the conflict that is going on over in Ukraine. And so she has gone through and vetted a few different 501c3 nonprofit organizations that are dedicated to the humanitarian efforts happening over there. Some of them dealing with animals, some of them dealing with the like hospital efforts. So for me, when I was invited into this anthology, it

was like, my heart expanded, I felt like, Yes, this is the thing that I can be doing to benefit. You know, the good in the world, the change that we want to see in the world. And so of course, I job jumped in on it immediately, because it just felt like the right thing to do. And I am so thrilled to be a part of it. And to have been asked by Sonia to be a part of this team. Now what was interesting is that I met Sonia and Tony, she is it must have been a year ago now or almost a year when I was actually presenting for the bayou writers down in Nola. So New Orleans, my friend, Paul Heingarten. He introduced me to his writing group, which is this bio writers group. And I got to meet both of these amazing individuals there. And so they happen to think about me a year later, after I did this presentation for their group. And it was just like, such a divine providence type situation. And so for those of you who are following my millionaire author mantra, my millionaire author, Destiny, stuff, I don't even know how to call it or how to describe it at the moment. But if you're following that stuff, I really do believe that we call into us the things that are meant for us because of our, our desires and the things that we put into our vibrational escrow as Abraham Hicks calls. And so for me, it was like I wanted to be of service I wanted to do something that was good and that I didn't understand or know how the best way to do it and to be able to marry up My love of writing and what I do for a living through my fiction with being able to help the humanitarian efforts, it was just such an incredible and wonderful thing. So I am so thrilled, like I said, to be a part of this anthology. But I'm also here to do this interview, because I want all of you to see number one, that when you are a part of something bigger than yourselves, you can actually move mountains as well, some of the things that you do, or some of the things that you're involved in, can be of tremendous help of starting some super change in your world. And so don't be afraid to join into things and to be a part of things that are bigger than just one person because it can do such good in the world. Number two, when you put up those rockets of desire, or you're putting up those wishes of what you want to see in this world, and how you want your life to live. Don't be surprised when they show up unexpectedly, because they do. And that's how this one came about. For me. It was just such an unexpected, wonderful surprise. And so I am so thrilled, like I said to be a part of this anthology, there is something like 34 of us so far in this amazing mystery thriller and dark fantasy anthology. And so so without further ado, I am going to let this interview speak for itself as we speak with Sonia and Anthony. Well, thank you so much for being on the Author Revolution Podcast. I am so excited that you're here, Sonya and Tony, I talked a little bit in the intro about how I got involved, how we met, how everything kind of came together. But could you tell my audience a little bit about who you guys are and what you write and what you do?

Sure, sure. Well, we write we do two different genres. We wrote supernatural thrillers under the Anthony M strong brand. And then we have just started our streets mystery thrillers, under new pen name am strong. And those are more in the vein of David Baldacci or the maybe a trust between Bob Archie and Jeffrey Deaver. So they're they're still dark, they still have have some dark elements in them. But they're they're not supernatural. They're they're straight mystery. So. So we've got both of those going on right now. And of course, the Anthology for Ukraine that we're putting together as well, which, which encompasses people from from various different genres.

Well, I'm just mostly the backup person. I do all the backend stuff for our little guest publishing company. I do the the marketing, I'm the initial editor before it goes off to another editor. We plot most of the stories together before everything. So that's why I call myself the grunt. The grunt

But let's talk about turning the tide and kind of where this concept came from. And like, what what was the How did the origin story come about for this anthology?

Sonya Sargent-Strong 08:37

Well, I mean, the funny thing is we it was on our on our anniversary, wasn't it? Yeah, yeah, we were out to dinner. And I had received an email earlier that day, from some animal charity that I give to you, we have, I should say back up a little bit and say that we have two dogs. And they're both rescues and animal rescue and animal charities are something that's really close to my heart. And I'm super, super passionate about. Back before the book writing was a thing. I used to have a pet product company, and I created a line of bamboo, organic bamboo dog collars and pet products. And then I gave 10% Of all the profits to various charities that were doing, doing things for the environment and animals. So anyway, I've sold that that was a while ago, but but Oh, charity and pet charity in particular has always been a passion of mine. So anyway, I had received an email earlier that day from some pet charity that we give to and they had mentioned this this company, this organization called the harmony Fund, and the harmony fund was going into Ukraine and rescuing all of the abandoned pets and getting food to them. The people that have taken their pets and were displaced from their homes, and they gotten over three tons of food to animals in need, and the, you know, the humans, you know, who were taking them with them. And, and when I started to read about it, I really wanted to do more to help, you know, we of course donated, but I wanted to be able to donate more than we could afford to donate. Because it's such a worthy cause. And it's such a terrible tragedy. So I was talking to Tony about it over dinner, this this harmony fund, and, you know, he was like, Well, you know, what can we do? We could use, you know, we could use our talents, and, you know, see if we can raise more money. So what if we do something where we, you know, put

something together and see if we can just raise more money for, you know, for the various, you know, charities because this, this war is absolutely terrible. And I think especially, you know, when it first was happening in February, and March, I think everybody was shocked, and, you know, feeling feeling really helpless. And what we can do to, you know, make the situation better ourselves. So that's, that's how it came around through through that. Yeah.

Yeah, I mean, it really was a an organic idea. It started fairly small. And our original plan was just to get together a couple of thriller authors, and put together and unfold anthology that way. And then as we talked about it more it began to expand into other genres and started to become more about supernatural. And also, like, Sunday Assembly got a couple of sci fi authors in. So it really it really did grow from a germ to become something a lot bigger. I think we've got 35-34.

There's no, I think we have 34 and 34. Right now, and we're still gonna question Yeah, because it became more about, you know, where we were like, Oh, we can do a thriller, you know, because, you know, you kind of go with your community first. Yeah. No thriller, and we know some authors and, but as we started expanding out, we wanted it to be more about the author's coming together to create something, you know, meaningful, something that's going to change, you know, people's lives. So we were able to meet with other authors and expand out into other genres. And the thing is, I don't know very many people who only read one straight genre. I read everything from cozy mystery to thrillers to supernatural to hauntings, but not horror. I don't read straightforward. No, it's true. And he writes, or sometimes hard when I'm editing, I'm like, don't make it gross.

I mean, just seeing that you've got some new york times bestselling authors in there, you've got some USA Today, bestselling authors in there, who do international best selling authors, and then just some amazing authors who are up and coming in the in their space, it's just, it's been incredible to watch it continue to grow. Like every time, I'm like, looking, I'm going holy cow. Last time, there was like 28. Now there's 32. And now it's 34. And so it's just like, This is so cool.

But I've noticed, it's already gotten, like, number one bestseller tags on Amazon, it's already been like high in the rankings. It's just been phenomenal already. And it's like, is anyone even talking about it yet? I'm like, what's happening here? This is so cool. Have you guys noticed that it's gotten those types of ready?

Yeah. Well, I fiddled with the categories over the weekend, and contacted Amazon to make sure that because when you put the book up, you know, you only get the three categories. So I looked up all the other categories that it should be in and I contacted them so that that helped to make a difference. And we started promoting it to our our email list in our readers, and we're most active on Facebook. So we've started, you know, promoting it to all of our Facebook people as well. And we're getting a really great response. And I even asked all the readers to also please go and share it. You know, let's get the word out. We've the more the more that we can get the word out the better. You know, the more we can get it. Yeah, yeah, absolutely. Why did I never do that? We never usually do that. We don't do that with our really I don't know, we don't normally advertise ourselves, we don't normally ask them, you know, to to also share or anything like that. It's the first time that we have ever done that. So Oh, my

goodness, that's amazing. Well, I've shared it in my newsletter already so far, obviously, you're gonna be on the podcast, go figure. And I've heard I was talking with Paul, and he was saying, you know that some of us are doing tic TOCs. And I already have my tic tock, like done and loaded. And I'm kind of waiting until we get a little closer to May to launch it to my draft folder. But I'll be doing more obviously in the month of May, because obviously, that's when it's going to be launching right. So let's see, what is this book coming out?

Yes, I can I printed it out so that I can sound like I know what I'm doing. Yeah, basically, the authors can donate to whoever they want, you know, whoever they see fit, but we had looked up and researched some of the the charities that are going into Ukraine and are working hard to make things better. And we wanted to make sure at least in the ones that we recommended that the bulk of any donations are going into into the actual work being done and off the top end that they're all 501 C three for you know, us authors and all that so the harmony fund was the one that got it started for me another one that's a great one is UNICEF, USA I don't know if you ever did this but when I was a kid and we go trick or treating on Halloween, we used to have our little you know, trick or treat bag and then we'd also have like a little UNICEF box I don't know if they still do that I'm sure that they probably don't we used to go I never heard of that. We used to go trick or treat UNICEF and what it was was they would give them to all the kids now I'm old I'm 49 so ancient, but they used to give them call the kid every year at Halloween to also go around and try to get you know like people to you know put in quarters or dollars or whatever for UNICEF so we used to go around and every year trick or treat UNICEF so it was like a it's been a long running charity. Yeah. But they specifically tried to help save and protect the world's most vulnerable children. And they're really one of the best charities to donate to. less than 3% of every dollar spent goes to administrative costs, which I think is amazing. To me, that is amazing. And then another one is med share. And med shares mission is to improve the quality of life for people in the planet med shares dedicated to improving health care and the environment for the efficient recovery, and redistribution of the surplus of medical supplies and equipment for those most in need. So they really focus more on the medical attention that people need absolute Direct Relief Fund is it's a humanitarian organization, it's active in all 50 states in more than 80 countries. And their mission is to improve the health and lives of people affected by poverty in emergencies. So they're going in there and helping with food and housing and things like that. And then another one that is specifically UK because we have several UK authors is the Disasters Emergency Committee,

and they're helping to meet the needs of refugees and displaced people. So those are all some really great charities that are that are working their butts off to, to help make a difference and help make make people's lives better over there right now.

And if you don't have the time, because we authors, you know, we're all headless chickens. If you don't have the time to vet it or go through it, sometimes it feels overwhelming to even like where do you begin? And so this, this list is really beneficial, I think to a lot of people who are listening

So what made you guys think about like having the author's themselves donate it versus just like the author giving over the the royalties to you guys that yes, everything that happens, just go ahead and donate like you choose the donation?



I'd say that was really our accountants. Because we've never put together an anthology, or a group of authors or anything. So when it came down to thinking, Oh, my goodness, there might be 30 to 40 people here, how do we take in the funds? How do we distribute it? We talked to a couple of the the wonderful companies out there like draft to digital, you know, they they will a lot of times, take a book, and then they'll send it out to Barnes and Noble, and Kobo and all the other Google Play and all that. I actually don't think they do Google Play. But all the other ones they know, yeah, several of them, they'll distribute it out. And they also have a way of doing a royalty share. So that it's split. But we were unable to do that, because one of our strategies is to do a really heavy push for pre orders. So that we get it all, you know, kind of sewn up by the time it releases, since it's only available for such a short time. And they were unable to do Amazon pre orders. So we ended up needing to put the book up for sale individually on every site ourselves. So when we spoke to our accountant, you know, he had suggested different ways of doing this, that was going to make sense and ended up settling on the basically putting it in our our accounts, setting it up and then distributing it when all the royalties come in distributing it to the authors, every author will get their share of it split evenly, and then they can donate it that way. They can also put it on in their taxes as a contribution.

And I think it also makes it makes it more alluring for the authors to be known that they can support the charity of their choice rather than having that decided for the

Like yeah, like my passion is our passion are the animals but somebody else, you know, might really want to do something like UNICEF that really helps children or, or mindshare that does the, you know, that deals with like the medical side of things. So we wanted them to be able to also make their own choices on what was important to them to help.



Yeah, absolutely. That makes a lot of sense. I know for me when I was first because that my assumption like when you were first talking about it to me, I was like Okay, that's great. Everything's gonna be donated and it didn't occur to me that we You get to choose. And so when I found that I was like, Oh, now I gotta dig more into these different charity organizations that you guys have put up. So I thought it was a really cool way of doing it. Because I've never

worked with an anthology like that. It's really neat. Thank you. Yeah. Okay, so we talked about when the anthology is going to be available for my readers, and all of your readers and everybody else's readers. So if they want to preorder the anthology, and help with the incredible efforts, where should they go?

Well, they can go to any online retailer to place to preorder if they go into Barnes and Noble, Kobo Amazon, and just put in Apple, yeah, put in turning the tide anthology, it should pop right up at the top.
